ORDER**ORIGINAL**

In this application Yosemite Valley Railway Company requests authority to discontinue agency service at its station of Merced Falls. Investigation discloses that since the abandonment of the operations of a lumber mill at this point practically all freight and passenger movement by rail in and out of this station has ceased, and that during the months of June and July of this year but \$111 total revenue accrued from business at Merced Falls, and that station expense was \$226. With the completion of the dismantling of the mill and town now in progress, even this small business will probably disappear.

It appears that no hearing is required in this matter, that public convenience and necessity no longer require the maintenance of an agent at Merced Falls, and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Yosemite Valley Railway Company is hereby authorized to abandon its agency at its station of Merced Falls, and to change its station records and tariffs accordingly, provided that said station be continued as a non-agency station, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) Applicant shall give not less than ten (10) days notice to the public of said agency abandonment by posting notice at said station.
- (2) Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.

- (3) The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
