OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, Harbor District Warehouse Company seeks authority to suspend its public utility warehouse operations on Mormon Island in the City of Los Angeles during the period its facilities are held by the United States of America. Applicant's verified representations in this matter show that possession of these facilities was secured under an order of the District Court in a proceeding numbered 26773-Civil and that subsequently a year-to-year lease was consummated providing that the United States may occupy the facilities in question until February 27, 1947. The warehouse company's operating authority, acquired from City & Harbor Warehouse, Ltd. (Decision No. 31552, 41 C.R.C. 668), is restricted to the rendition of service on the site on Mormon Island specified in Decision No. 22972 (35 C.R.C. 315). Applicant contends that for these reasons it is temporarily unable to provide public storage service.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that temporary suspension of applicant's operations should be authorized. The authority granted herein will be limited to February 27, 1945, unless sooner changed, canceled or extended.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Harbor District Warehouse Company be and it is hereby authorized to suspend operations as a public utility warehouseman at Mormon Island in the City of Los Angeles until February 27, 1945, unless sooner changed, canceled or extended by appropriate order of the Commission.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Harbor District Warehouse Company shall forthwith amend its tariffs on file with the Commission on not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and to the public to show that its operations have been suspended as authorized herein.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
