SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Commission's Decision No. 34797 in this case, issued on November 26, 1941, provided, among other things, that gas sold under surplus gas schedules would not be available to new customers or for new uses unless each such customer then shall have other sources of fuel available for ready use in the event of shutoff of gas service by the utility unless approval first be obtained from this Commission.

On this date, December 1, 1943, a telegram has been received from the Southern California Gas Company asking for emergency relief from the above order for the purpose of making available approximately 1,500,000 cubic feet of surplus gas under an existing contract for a period of approximately twenty-four hours for use in starting a new octane gasoline plant at the Norwalk Refinery, which plant has no standby fuel supply.

In order to meet the emergency situation referred to IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern California Gas Company may render gas service as hereinabove stated to the Norwalk refinery.

The effective date of this Order shall be the date hereof.
