FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Pursuant to an application duly filed, Morton Air Academy, in Decision No. 36626 in this proceeding, dated September 28, 1943, was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the transportation of passengers between Morton Air Academy and Blythe, California.

The application was in the name of Morton Air Academy, and was signed by Ted Morton as President. There was nothing to indicate that applicant was either a corporation or a partnership.

Subsequent to the effective date of the order the Commission was advised by applicant that it was a limited partnership of which said Ted Morton was a general partner and William V. O'Connor a limited partner.

Good cause appearing, it is therefore ordered that the first ordering paragraph of said Decision No. 36626 be deleted and that there be substituted in lieu thereof the following:

"IT IS ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity be and it hereby is granted to Ted Morton and William

V. O'Connor, partners, authorizing the establishment and operation of service as a passenger stage corporation, as defined in Section 24 of the Public Utilities Act, for the transportation of passengers between Blythe and Morton Air Academy, located approximately seven miles northwest of Blythe, subject to the following condition:

"The authority herein granted is subject to the provisions of section 52(b) of the Public Utilities Act and further to the condition that Ted Morton and William V. O'Connor, their successors or assigns, shall never claim before this Commission, or any court or other public body, a value for said operative rights or claim as the cost thereof, an amount in excess of that paid to the State as the consideration for such rights."

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
