FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Commission by Decision No. 36700, dated November 9, 1943, in the above-entitled matter, authorized Associated Telephone Company, Ltd. to sell, on or before December 31, 1943, to the State of California, the parcel of real property described in Exhibit 3 on file in this application. In a Supplemental Petition filed on December 27, applicant reports that it will be impossible for the Division of Highways, State of California, to complete the procedural steps necessary to the termination of the escrow and to the completion of the sale of said real property by December 31, 1943. It, therefore, requests the Commission to extend the time of the authorization to sell said real property to and including March 1, 1944.

The Commission has considered applicant's request and believes that such request should be granted, therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the provision of Decision No. 36700, dated November 9, 1943, reading:

"IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Associated Telephone Company, Ltd. be, and it is hereby, authorized to sell on or before December 31, 1943, to the State of California the parcel of real property described in Exhibit 3 on file in this application."

be, and the same is hereby, amended so as to read:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Associated Telephone Company, Ltd. be, and it is hereby, authorized to sell on or before March 1, 1944, to the State of California the parcel of real property described in Exhibit 3 on file in this application.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that said Decision No. 36700, dated November 9, 1943, shall remain in full force and effect except as modified by this First Supplemental Order.
