O P I N I O N

In this application, as amended, The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company asks permission to sell to the United States of America, Department of the Navy, for \$4,900, the following distributing plant located at Hunters Point Naval Drydock Reservation, San Francisco:

All of the plant was constructed in 1942 and 1943 with the exception of 51 feet of 26-pair cable which was constructed in December, 1941. The cost of the plant is reported at \$5,059.75.

It is of record that the Department of the Navy now owns all of the distributing plant at Hunters Point Naval Drydock Reservation except that mentioned herein. The properties owned by applicant are interwoven with those owned by the Navy. It desires to own all of the distributing system. The testimony shows that the Navy will permit applicant to use certain circuits for non-Navy service and that there will be no change in service or in the rates to non-Navy subscribers.

No one appeared at the hearing to protest the granting of this application.

O R D E R

A public hearing having been held in the above entitled matter before Examiner Fankhauser and the Commission having considered the evidence submitted at such hearing and it being of the opinion that this application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company be, and it is hereby, authorized to sell for \$4,900 to the United States of America, Department of the Navy, on or before July 1, 1944, the properties described in the foregoing Opinion.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the authority herein granted shall become effective upon the date hereof.
