OPINION AND ORDER

This is an application by Thomas C. Van Horn for a license to engage in the business of a motor carrier transportation agent as defined in the Motor Carrier Transportation Agent Act (Chapter 390, Statutes 1933 as amended).

The matter was set down for hearing on February 2 before Examiner Gannon at Los Angeles. At the outset of the hearing applicant, through his counsel, stated that he did not desire to proceed with the hearing on account of his physical condition, which would not permit him to conduct the type of business for which he was seeking a license. In view of these circumstances he requested that the application be dismissed and it will be so ordered.
