BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of GIBSON LINES, a corporation, for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to operate an automotive stage service for the transportation of passengers and their hand bassage, between Fourth and E Streets and Covilaud and Seventeenth Streets, all within the City of Marysville, in consolidation with passenger stage service now conducted by Gibson Lines, limited in frequency to five round trips per day and to terminate six months after the duration of the war.

BY THE COMMISSION:

OPINION AND ORDER

In this application Gibson Lines seeks a certificate of public convenience and necessity to perform a passenger stage service between Fourth and E Streets on the one hand, and 17th and Covilaud Streets on the other hand, all within the City of Marysville, in consolidation with its existing passenger stage service.

Applicant alleges that in the vicinity of Covilaud and 17th Streets terminal a United States Government trailer camp and housing project has been installed and occupied, known as Hub City Trailer Homes, and the residents of this area need transportation service into the business area of Marysville in the vicinity of 4th and E Streets.

Applicant proposes to operate this as a limited service consisting of five round trips per day, with a local fare of five cents between any point along the route.

It appears that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted.

Applicant is placed upon notice that "operative rights" as such do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the granting of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive

Commencing at the intersection of Fourth and E Streets, thence along Fourth Street to B Street, thence along B Street to loth Street, thence along loth Street to Yuba Street, thence along Yuba Street to 12th Street, thence along 12th Street to Buchanan Street, thence along Buchanan Street to 17th Street, thence along 17th Street to the intersection of 17th and Covilaud Streets; returning via the same route.

- (3) Applicant shall operate not more than five round trips per day unless further authority is granted by this Commission.
- (4) Applicant shall comply with the rules of this Commission's General Order No. 79 and Part IV of its General Order No. 93-A, by filing, in triplicate, and concurrently making effective tariffs and time schedules as set forth in the application and satisfactory to this Commission within thirty (30) days from the effective date hereof, and upon not less than one day's notice to the Commission and the public.
- (5) Applicant is authorized to turn its motor vehicles at termini, either in the intersection of the streets or by operating around a block contiguous to such intersection in either direction, and to carry passengers as traffic regulations of the municipality may require.

The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders in this proceeding as to it may seem just and proper, and to revoke this authority in whole or in part if in its opinion public convenience and necessity demand such action.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hercof.
