The Western Pacific Railroad Company is authorized to construct an additional spur track at grade across Madison Street and to relecate an existing track (Track No. 7) across the intersection of 4th and Madison Streets, in Oakland, Alameda County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. 4-7.0. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 4 of G. O. No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway, and with grades of approach conforming as nearly as practicable with existing street grades. No additional fixed protection is required at this time but train movements shall be flagged across said streets.

Upon completion existing Track No. 7 erossing 4th Street and Madison Street shall be removed.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with.
