BY THE COMMISSION:

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION

By the order in our Decision No. 36475, Bruce W. Robb, doing business as Tassajara Hot Springs Stage was authorized to suspend service for the transportation of passengers, baggage and express until May 1, 1944. The order of suspension was based on applicant's showing that Tassajara Hot Springs would not be open to the public during 1943, and hence there was no need for the service.

Applicant now advises the Commission that the same conditions which prevailed last summer exist now, and he accordingly requests that the order of suspension be extended to May 1, 1945.

In view of these circumstances it appears that the application should be granted.

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That Bruce W. Robb is hereby authorized to suspend until May 1, 1945, the operation of his service for the transportation of passengers, baggage and express between Salinas and

Tassajara Hot Springs, as defined in Decision No. 25928.

(2) That applicant comply with and observe the following service regulations,

- (a) Bruce W. Robb shall comply with General Orders Nos. 79 and 80 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A, by filing, in triplicate, amendments to his present tariffs and time tables reflecting the authority herein granted, within sixty (60) days from the date hereof and upon not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and the public.
- (b) Said service may be resumed only upon notice to the Commission of not less than ten (10) days prior to the expiration of the period of suspension herein specified or of such extension thereof as may be hereafter granted by further order, and upon compliance with the provisions of General Orders Nos. 79 and 80 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
