OPINION AND ORDER

By this application, W. H. Sisk seeks authority to sell and Adelbert Pflaging seeks authority to purchase property and equipment used in a public utility warehouse business conducted at Harp, Stanislaus County.<sup>1</sup> The verified application shows that Sisk cannot continue to operate the warehouse efficiently because of his ill health and that Pflaging is thoroughly familiar with the business and well qualified to operate it. No change in the tariff rates or in the service to the public is proposed. The consideration involved is \$10.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted. It should be clearly understood, however, that this authorization is not an approval of the purchase price in any respect, nor a finding of value for the purpose of rate fixing, issuance of securities, accounting, or for any other purpose.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that W. H. Sisk be and he is hereby authorized to sell and Adelbert Pflaging be and he is hereby authorized to purchase the property and equipment used in the operation of a public utility warehouse business at Harp, Stanislaus County.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that applicants shall comply with the rules of the Commission's General Order No. 61 by filing, in duplicate, and concurrently making effective, tariffs satisfactory to the Commission within sixty (60) days from the effective date hereof and on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
