ORDER OF REVOCATION

In the above-entitled application Thor Kofod requests the authority of the Commission to discontinue his operation of a highway common carrier service and for an order revoking the certificate therefor.

The operative right involved was granted to applicant by the Commission's Decision No. 28611, rendered March 2, 1936, in Application No. 19984. It authorizes the transportation of fresh asparagus, fresh fruits and vegetables between the Sacramento River delta region on the one hand and the commission and brokerage market districts in San Francisco and Oakland on the other hand. In support of the authority as requested, it is alleged that very little asparagus is produced at this time in the area this applicant is authorized to serve. It is also pointed out that by the same decision granting applicant's right, a similar certificate was granted to L.P. Kerner, Jr. and transferred under the Commission's authority to William Dinelli. Applicant asserts that Dinelli's operation is more than sufficient to provide ample service for this traffic at this time; and that there is no present public need for applicant to continue his operation. This is not a matter requiring a public hearing.

THEREFORE, and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Thor Kofod is hereby authorized

to discontinue and abandon the highway common carrier service authorized by the Commission's Decision No. 28611, in Application No. 19984, and the certificate therefor, created by said Decision is hereby revoked and annulled.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all tariffs and time tables on file with the Commission in the name of Thor Kofod and in effect are hereby cancelled.

The effective date of this Order shall be the date hereof.
