FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By the order in Decision No. 31649, dated January 11, 1939, Key System and Interurban Electric Railway Company were authorized to enter into an agreement pertaining to the operation of passenger train service by the Bridge Railway over the San Francisco - Oakland Bay Bridge. Said applicants were each required by said order to file monthly reports covering the maintenance and operation of said Bridge Railway.

Interurban Electric Railway has now abandoned and Key System is the sole operator of Bridge Railway and it appears that the filing of said reports are no longer required.

Good Cause Appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the second order in paragraph one on sheet three of Decision No. 31649 reading as follows:

"IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that Key System and Interurban Electric Railway Company file with the Railroad Commission monthly reports showing by accounts the amounts charged to operating expense accounts and/or income accounts under the system of accounts prescribed by the Interstate Commerce Commission covering the maintenance and operation of the Bridge Railway as provided for in the agreement filed in this proceeding as Exhibit 'A', and that said reports shall show separately all expenses jointly incurred and allocated through the medium of the Terminal Organization. Said monthly reports shall be filed not later than forty-five days after the close of the month for which the report is rendered."

is hereby rescinded and of no further force and effect.
