## SIXTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 36446 of June 22, 1943, in this proceeding, authorizes applicants to transport lumber and forest products (except sash and doors) for Owens-Parks Lumber Company, from its lumber yard in Vernon to points within a 30-mile radius thereof, at rates less than those established as minima until June 22, 1944. An indefinite extension of this authority is now sought. The verified application shows that this traffic is handled under unusually favorable conditions and that under these conditions the authorized rates have returned a satisfactory profit.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that an extension of applicants' authority is justified. However, due to the possibility that the conditions under which the service is rendered may change at any time, the authority will be limited to a one-year period.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of Decision No. 36446 of June 22, 1943, in the above entitled proceeding be and it is hereby extended to June 22, 1945, unless sconer changed, canceled or further extended by appropriate order of the Commission. This order shall become effective June 22, 1944.
