BY THE COMMISSION:

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
In Decision No. 36119, dated January 26, 1943, in Application No. 25434, the Commission authorized C. J. Lamb, doing business as Lamb Transportation Co. to suspend, until July 1, 1944, operation as a highway common carrier for the transportation of certain named commodities between Long Beach, Los Angeles, (1) Wilmington and San Pedro.

The allegations of applicant set forth that the intercoastal and coastwise steamship service between the Ports of Los Angeles Harbor and Long Beach had been entirely discontinued subsequent to December 7, 1941, as a result of which said commodities

had ceased moving through these ports and applicant had received no goods for transportation between the points he had been authorized to serve.

In the instant proceeding applicant alleges that there will be neither intercoastal nor coastwise steamship service for the transportation of flour and bakery supplies, kerosene in cases, glassware or bottles to Los Angeles Harbor or the Port of Long

Beach prior to July 1, 1946, and that he desires to further suspend all operation unti " that date.

This is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. The request of applicant appears reasonable and in the public interest and the application will, therefore, be granted.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED:

(1) That C. J. Lamb is hereby authorized to suspend until July 1, 1946, operation as a highway common carrier for the transportation of the commodities and between the points as described in Decision No. 17756, dated December 13, 1926, in Application No. 12254.

(2) That C. J. Lamb shall, within thirty (30) days, file, in triplicate, and upon not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and the public a supplement to its tariffs and time tables showing the suspension of service as herein authorized.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof. Dated at San Trancisco, California, this day or July ____, 1944.
