SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 35722 of September 1, 1942, as amended, authorized applicant to suspend its public utility warehouse operations, which were limited to the storage of new automobiles in San Francisco, until September 1, 1944. Authority is now sought to continue the suspension until September 1, 1945, or for the duration of the war and six months thereafter.

The verified application shows that the premises formerly occupied by applicant and which were vacated in order to make the warehouse available to the United States Army are still being used by the army; and that no demand for public storage of new automobiles is anticipated until some time after the termination of the war unless their manufacture for sale to the public generally should be permitted at an earlier date.

Under the circumstances, it appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that a one-year extension of applicant's authority is justified.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted by Decision No. 35722 of September 1, 1942, as amended, in the above entitled application, be and it is hereby

further extended to September 1, 1945, unless sooner changed, canceled or extended by appropriate order of the Commission.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Souther Warehouse Company shall, upon exercising the authority herein granted, amend its tariffs on file with the Commission on not less than three (3) days' notice to the Commission and to the public to show that operations have been further suspended as authorized herein.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
