OPINION AND ORDER

**ORIGINAL**

By this application, Maurice Strain seeks authority to lease a public utility warehouse and its equipment at Sutter, Sutter County, to John F. Ohrt. The verified application shows that Strain's activities in connection with the war effort require his detailed attention and that Ohrt is qualified to conduct the operations involved. No change in rates or service is proposed.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Maurice Strain be and he is hereby authorized to lease the public utility property involved in this proceeding to John F. Ohrt and to execute a lease agreement; said agreement to be in substantially the same form as the agreement attached to the application as Exhibit 1.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that immediately upon the leasing of the property involved Maurice Strain and John F. Ohrt shall, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public, supplement or reissue tariffs on file with the Commission in so far as they name rates, rules and regulations governing warehouse operations of Maurice Strain at Sutter, Sutter County, to

show that he has withdrawn or canceled and that John F. Ohrt has concurrently adopted or established as his own, said rates, rules and regulations; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall in all other respects comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
