OPINION AND ORDER

These proceedings involve service of Southern California Freight Forwarders to and from twenty-nine points in southern California. Applicant originally sought authority to suspend service; by amended application it sought authority to abandon service permanently; and by subsequent petition it now states that it feels justified in rendering the service and asks that the application be dismissed. Case No. 4699 is an investigation instituted by the Commission for the purpose of determining whether applicant's right to serve the points should be revoked or annulled because of unauthorized discontinuance or suspension of service.

Upon consideration of these circumstances, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application proceeding should be dismissed and the investigation discontinued.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Application No. 25575 be and it is hereby dismissed and the investigation in Case No. 4699 be and it is hereby discontinued.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
