SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION

In the above entitled application Inglewood City Lines, a corporation, requests the Commission to authorize it to extend its so-called Prairie Avenue Motor Coach Route from the intersection of Prairie Avenue and East Broadway to the intersection of Hawthorne Boulevard and El Segundo Boulevard, in Hawthorne, to enable it to provide a through service for its patrons between the northeasterly residential section and the business section of Hawthorne without the necessity of such patrons changing from one piece of equipment to another and the payment of an additional fare.

Applicant's operations are conducted pursuant to a certificate issued by Decision No. 36351, dated May 11, 1943. This is the only certificate now held by this carrier and was issued to it to replace the numerous certificates which it had theretofore acquired under the authority of the Commission. The old certificates were revoked. The new certificate in substance authorizes applicant to provide passenger stage service between the various points named therein, including all intermediate points, without any limitations or restrictions. The streets,

roads and highways which applicant is required to use in providing a fully adequate, complete and unified service between the points indicated in the certificate are specified in one of the service regulations of the order of said Decision No. 36351, as distinguished from the certificate. These routes were modified in certain minor respects by Decision No. 36862. The manner of describing the routes to be used in no way limits or restricts the manner in which applicant may operate its equipment to provide service to meet fully the transportation needs of the public which it serves. According to the application, applicant presently operates its so-called Prairie Avenue Motor Coach Route over and along Prairie Avenue between its intersection with Manchester Boulevard, in Inglewood, and its intersection with East Broadway in Hawthorne and, as above stated, desires to extend this particular route along Broadway and Hawthorne Boulevard to the intersection of El Segundo Boulevard. An examination of the service regulations of the order of said Decision No. 36351, as referred to above, discloses that applicant is already permitted to use this route without further authority.

Applicant states that it would charge 5 cents without transfer over its present Prairie Avenue Motor Coach Route and the proposed extension to the intersection of Hawthorne Boulevard and El Segundo Boulevard under the provisions of its Local Passenger Tariff No. 1, C.R.C. No. 1. Reference to this tariff shows that applicant is charging a local 5 cents fare over its Line 6-Prairie Avenue, between the intersection of Market and Regent Streets, Inglewood, and the intersection of Broadway and Prairie Avenue, Hawthorne. An additional local 5 cents fare is now charged between the last named intersection and the intersection of Hawthorne Boulevard and El Segundo Boulevard, Hawthorne,

and points beyond on its Alondra Park-Hawthorne Airport Line 5. To establish the proposed 5 cents fare for through traffic the Commission's approval is not necessary. It may be established by filing an appropriate revision of the tariff.

In as much as applicant, as above stated, now holds the necessary authority to operate over the route involved the application will be dismissed.

SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Second Supplemental Application No. 25483 is hereby dismissed without prejudice.
