BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the Matter of the Application of the
 County of San Mateo, a political sub-
 division of the State of California, for
 an order authorizing the County of San
 Mateo to construct, at grade, a pedestrian
 crossing over the rights of way and rail-
 road tracks of Southern Pacific Company
 and Market Street Railway Company, in the
 County of San Mateo, State of California.

BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

The County of San Mateo is authorized to construct a pedestrian crossing at grade across the main line tracks of Southern Pacific Company and of Market Street Railway Company near Milbrae, San Mateo County, at the location shown on the map attached to the application. The crossing with Southern Pacific Company's tracks shall be identified as Crossing No. E-13.3-D. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance cost outside of lines two feet outside of outer rails of the tracks of each company. Southern Pacific Company and Market Street Railway Company shall bear maintenance cost between such lines of their respective tracks. Width of crossing shall be not over eight feet. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. 72. Protection shall be by one Standard No. 1 crossing sign at each crossing (G. O. 75-B).

Suitable and substantial posts spaced not greater than four feet apart shall be installed on or near each right of way line of Southern Pacific Company in such a manner as to effectively prevent the passage of vehicles over the railroad tracks.

Upon completion, the existing crossing, located about 400 feet northwesterly from the crossing herein authorized, shall be abandoned and closed. Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This

authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
