In the Matter of the Application of WALTER B. TINDELL for authority to temporarily suspend operation as a common carrier between Monterey, Turlock, Modesto, Stockton, Sacramento, and River points and between intermediate points.

BY THE COMMISSION:

SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Walter B. Tindell was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity for the transportation of fish between (1) Sacramento, Monterey and certain intermediate points.

Upon application duly filed he was authorized to (2) temporarily discontinue such service until April 30, 1943. Such order was based upon applicant's allegation that no fish were being brought in to him for transportation, due to the fact that alien fishermen were precluded during the war from engaging in the fishing industry. Subsequently, for the same reason, said period of (3) suspension was extended to April 30, 1944.

In the application now before us, it is alleged that the conditions which heretofore required temporary suspension of service still exist, and applicant requests a further extension of the period of suspension.

IT IS ORDERED that the period of suspension authorized by Decision No. 36524, dated July 27, 1943, is hereby extended to April 30, 1945, provided that applicant Walter B. Tindell amend his tariff and time schedule, on not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and the public, to show that such service has been suspended as authorized herein.
