OPINION AND ORDER

A. C. Jacobsen, doing business as the Jacobsen Water System, requests authority to discontinue water service to consumers residing on Thirty-sixth Avenue, north of Sixteenth Street, on Sixteenth Street, east of Thirty-sixth Avenue, and on Bridge Avenue, north of Sixteenth Street, in the City of Oakland, Alameda County, California.

The application alleges that the mains in these streets have deteriorated to such an extent that they are beyond repair, and that all consumers supplied from them are now furnished water service by the East Bay Municipal Utility District.

An investigation shows that 16 consumers were served from 1600 feet of 2-inch main in the area that applicant seeks to abandon service, and that the District has its mains installed in these streets and is now serving all of applicant's former consumers. Applicant is continuing water service from his well supply to 13 consumers on Thirty-sixth Avenue, south of Sixteenth Street, through 800 feet of 2-inch main.

Under the circumstances, a public hearing appears unnecessary, and A. C. Jacobsen, doing business as Jacobsen Water System, is hereby authorized to

discontinue water service and be relieved of all public utility obligations of supplying water to those consumers residing in the above described section of Oakland.

This Order shall become effective immediately.
