OPINION AND ORDER

By this application Floyd A. Greene and D. J. Glardon, copartners doing business as Arrow Transfer, seek a one-year extension of the authority granted by Decision No. 36676 of October 26, 1943, in Application No. 25733, to transport flour in truckload lots from public team tracks to San Diego bakeries at rates less than the established minimum rates. The present authority expires October 26, 1944.

The verified application shows that although certain costs incurred in performing the transportation involved have increased somewhat they have been offset by operating economies which have been effected and that under these conditions the authorized rates have returned a satisfactory profit.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the requested extension of authority is justified. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of Decision No. 36676 of October 26, 1943, in Application No. 25733, be and it is hereby extended to October 26, 1945, unless sooner changed, cancelled

or further extended by appropriate order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective October 26, 1944.
