O R D E R

The United States of America and Pacific Electric Railway Company are authorized to construct a main track at grade across several streets and alleys in the City of Seal Beach and the vicinity thereof at the locations shown on the map filed with the application, to be identified and protected as follows:

| 16th Street | 6E-24.44 | 2 " | " 1 Crossing Signs |

| 17th Street | 6E-24.50 | 2 " | " 1 " " |
| Alley | 6E-24.54-D | 1 " | " 1 " " |
| Bay Boulevard | 6E-24.53 | 2 " | " 3 Flashing Lights |
| Surf Avenue | 6E-25.56 | 2 " | " 1 Crossing Signs |

Applicants shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction of said crossings shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72, without super-elevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding those shown on print attached to the application.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order,

applicants shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
