FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION

By Decision No. 37301, rendered August 29, 1944, in
this proceeding, a certificate was issued authorizing applicants
Mary Maritzen and E. B. Osthues, partners doing business as The
Modesto Transit Company, to conduct a passenger stage service
between Modesto and the Hammond-Vernalis Reconditioning Camp.
In their supplemental application, applicants state that when
the original application was filed they had been advised by the
military authorities that service to and from the Reconditioning
Camp should be established by September 1, 1944. They now allege,
however, that the camp is still in process of construction and
probably will not be completed and activated before January 1,
1945; until this occurs there will be no occasion to transport
passengers between Modesto and the camp. Applicants, therefore,
request that the time for acceptance of this certificate be
extended so as to permit its filing at any time within thirty
days following January 1, 1945. Under the circumstances, the

request will be granted and our decision will be modified accordingly.

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Supplemental application having been filed herein; and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED as follows:

- (1) That the time within which applicants may file their written acceptance of the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to them by Decision No. 37301, rendered herein August 29, 1944, be and it hereby is extended until and including February 1, 1945.
- (2) That the time within which applicants may comply with the provisions of paragraph (2) of the service regulations provided by said Decision No. 37301, be and it hereby is extended until and including March 1, 1945.
- (3) That in all other respect, Decision No. 37301 shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
