BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

Pacific Electric Railway Company, a corporation, has applied for authority to sell a parcel of operative property in the vicinity of Long Beach to William Lynn Jones and Ellen Elizabeth Jones, husband and wife, for the sum of \$475.00, and to remove the end of a spur track now located on said property.

It appears that neither the track nor the property is required in the performance of any service to the public and that the application should be granted, subject to certain conditions.

IT IS ORDERED that Pacific Electric Railway Company is hereby authorized to sell that certain parcel of property described in the application and shown on the map accompanying the application for the sum of \$475.00, subject to the following conditions:

1. Applicant shall within thirty days thereafter, notify the Commission in writing of the completion of the property transfer herein authorized.
2. The authorization herein granted shall not be construed as a determination of the value of the property for any purpose other than the transfer herein authorized.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the applicant is authorized to remove approximately 700 feet of track at the end of its so-called Daisy Avenue spur, now located on the property to be transferred and

including the crossing with Golden Avenue, identified as Crossing No. 6LA-16.31.

Within thirty days thereafter, applicant shall report in writing to the Commission the removal of said track. The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one year from the date hereof, unless further time is granted by subsequent order. The authorization herein granted shall be effective immediately.
