BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In the matter of the application of Southern Pacific Company and Southern Pacific Railroad Company for an Order authorizing the construction at grade of a proposed line of railroad across three city streets and one road in the City of Yuba City, County of Sutter, State of California.

O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to construct a main line track at grade across Sutter Street, Teegarden Avenue, Second Street, and an unnamed road leading from Teegarden Avenue, all in Yuba City, Sutter County, at the locations described in the application. Crossing numbers will be assigned by letter from the Commission. Teegarden Avenue and Second Street are not traveled at the points of crossing, and this order shall not be construed as authorizing the opening of said streets across said track. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction of said crossings with Sutter Street and the unnamed road shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72, without super-elevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding one per cent at Sutter Street or six per cent at the crossing with the unnamed road. Protection shall be by one Standard No. 1 crossing sign, (G. O. No. 75-B), at the crossing with the unnamed road, and by two Standard No. 8 Flashing Light Signals at the crossing with Sutter Street.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time

be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
