FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

In Decision No. 36286 in this application the Commission authorized the construction of a grade separation of State highway with the Woodland branch of Sacramento Northern Railway near Washington, Yolo County, in accordance with plans attached to the original application. The Department of Public Works has now revised its plan for this grade separation and filed a supplemental application requesting the rescinding of the former order and approval of the revised plan. Said crossing is to be located adjacent to an existing crossing of this highway under the railroad, and upon completion will accommodate the westbound traffic of a divided highway.

Good Cause Appearing, IT IS ORDERED that Decision No. 36286, dated April 6, 1943, is hereby rescinded.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Department of Public Works of the State of California is authorized to construct a crossing of State Highway (Road III Yolo-6-C) at separated grades under the tracks of Sacramento Northern Railway near Washington, Yolo County, at the location shown by the map, (Exhibit A) attached to the First Supplemental Application filed on September 22, 1944, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. 8B-0.4-B. The cost of constructing and maintaining said grade separation shall be in accordance with an agreement to be entered into by the applicant and Sacramento Northern Railway, and a

copy of said agreement and plans of said crossing approved by Sacramento Northern Railway shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within two years from the end of the existing war unless time be extended. This order shall be effective immediately.
