SECOND SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 36826, dated January 18, 1944, on Appli-
cation No. 25146, Asbury Rapid Transit System was authorized to
abandon, until January 1, 1945, motor coach service for that
portion of its Pasadena-Hollywood-Ocean Park Division between the
intersection of Marshfield Way and La Brea Avenue in the City of
Los Angeles, on the one hand, and Ocean Park, on the other hand,
over a specified route. The reasons assigned were lack of patron-
age of the service and a desire to conserve rubber, manpower and
equipment.

Applicants now request authority to further continue the
suspension of this service for the duration of the war and six
months thereafter for the reason that conditions have not changed
since the filing of the original application for suspension.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Asbury Rapid Transit System is
hereby authorized to further discontinue the motor coach service

referred to in the foregoing opinion to January 1, 1946.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
