ORDER OF DISMISSAL

This matter was instituted by the Commission on its own motion October 21, 1941. The Bay Cities Transit Company filed its Application No. 24894, April 3, 1942, seeking authority to make major changes in its routing. The two matters were heard on a common record and an order issued, Decision No. 36042, December 15, 1942. In this order the Commission authorized a number of reroutings, abandonments and extensions of the Bay Cities Transit Company's system. This decision disposed of the matters involved in the application. The decision also directed the company to make a change in its fare structure to the effect that there was to be added a fare of six tokens for 25 cents as an alternative to the existing 5-cent zone fare.

The company filed a petition for rehearing January 14, 1943, seeking a modification of the Commission's order with respect to the token rate prescribed in said Decision No. 36042. By letter, under date of November 23, 1943, the company requested dismissal of said petition for a modification of this order.

There is nothing now pending before the Commission in Case No. 4612, therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that the above-entitled case be and it hereby is dismissed.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
