Arthur M. Bowers requests authority to sell to LeRoy Fittman his operative right for the transportation of passengers between National City and Lincoln Acres, San Diego County, and intermediate points, and also to sell to said Fittman certain automotive equipment. The latter seaks authority to purchase said right and equipment.

The operative right proposed to be transferred was created by the Commission's Decision No. 36375, dated May 25, 1943, on Application No. 25488.

Public hearing was held before Examiner Chiesa at San Diego on January 26, 1945, evidence was received, the matter was submitted, and now is ready for decision.

The cyldence discloses that because of poor health Arthur M. Bowers is unable to continue the operation of his

passenger stage business and that by agreement with LeRoy

Pittman the latter agreed to take over said business and

the operative right as of January 14, 1944, for a consider
ation of \$1,432.08, subject to the Commission's approval.

Said purchase price represents the value of equipment only,

consisting of one 21-passenger Yellow Coach bus with 1940

Ford motor and one 7-passenger 1938 Cadillac-8 sedan, as

no value was placed on the operative right.

Operating results for the period between Mey 25, 1943, and January 14, 1944 are not available; however, the record shows that for the period of January 14, 1944, to December 31, 1944, gross operating revenues and expenses were \$14,833.55 and \$9,470.52, respectively.

The financial condition of LeRoy Pittman as of February 8, 1945, was as follows: tangible assets \$3,940.08; liabilities \$655.81; net worth \$ 3.284.27.

The City of National City having received complaints from applicant's patrons charging that the service was not entirely satisfactory appeared in protest. No complainants appeared at the hearing and applicant Fittman testified that very few complaints have come to his attention although unavoidable delays occur at times.

After full consideration of this matter the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the proposed transfer is in the public interest and, therefore, the application will be granted.

The action taken herein shall not be construed to be a finding of value for any purpose.

Le Roy Pittman is hereby placed upon notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate-fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. Aside from their purely permissive aspect, they extend to the holder a full or partial menceoly of a class of business over a particular route. This monopoly feature may be changed or destroyed at any time by the State, which is not in any respect limited to the number of rights which may be given.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED as follows:

- (1) That Arthur M. Bowers is hereby authorized to sell and transfer, on or before June 30, 1945, and Le Roy Pittman is hereby authorized to purchase and acquire, and hereafter to operate thereunder, the operative right created by Decision No. 36375, dated May 25, 1943, and the automotive equipment referred to in the foregoing opinion.
- (2) That applicants herein shall comply with the rules of the Commission's General Order No. 79 and Part IV of No. 93-A by filing, in triplicate, and concurrently making effective appropriate tariffs and time tables within sixty (60) days from the effective date hereof and not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and the public.

(3) That within thirty (30) days after the transfer of the properties, as herein authorized, Le Roy Pittman shall file with the Railroed Commission a copy of the bill of sale executed under the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
