SIXTH SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

For reasons set forth in Decision No. 32842, as amended, in this proceeding, Fred N. Worth, who acquired C. A. Worth & Co. through the distribution of the estate of Minnie I. Worth, deceased, was authorized to transport drugs, drug sundries and liquors for Coffin-Redington from San Francisco to specified East Bay points under a monthly rate in lieu of the per-shipment rates Which Would otherwise be applicable. This authority expires February 28, 1945. An extension of one year is now sought.

The verified application discloses that conditions surrounding the transportation in question remain the same as when last considered a year ago and that operations under the authorized rate
continue to be compensatory.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the sought extension is justified.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted Fred N. Worth by Decision No. 32842, as amended, in this proceeding, be and it is hereby extended to February 28, 1946, unless sooner changed, canceled or further extended by appropriate order of the Commission.

This order shall become effective February 28, 1945.
