BY THE COMMISSION:

O P I N I O N

Pete Bordenave and Garrett W. Beckley, copartners doing business under the firm name of Bordenave & Beckley, are authorized to engage in the business of transporting livestock, upon an on-call basis, generally between Los Angeles and Orland, and certain specified points intermediate thereto; and between such points, on the one hand, and San Francisco and South San Francisco, on the other hand. ⁽¹⁾

In this application, request is made for authority to suspend operation of said service for a period of one year. The application alleges, in effect, that Garrett W. Beckley, one of the copartners, has been in the service of the United States Army for about one year and that with operating expenses steadily increasing the business has been operated at a loss during the past year.

Subsequent to the filing of this application, a number of informal conferences, which were participated in by representatives of the Federal Government, the State and the carriers, have been held dealing with the question of intrastate transportation of livestock from the public's standpoint, particularly the problems arising out of wartime conditions. It appears that the public interest will not be adversely affected by the granting of this application under prevailing conditions and no public hearing is necessary.

O R D E R

Good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that Pete Bordenave and Garrett W. Beckley, copartners, are hereby authorized to suspend their highway common carrier service, as authorized in Decision No. 35979, until December 31, 1945: In the exercise of the authority herein granted, applicants shall observe the following service regulations:

1. Applicants shall immediately supplement their tariffs and time tables to indicate the suspension of service herein authorized.
2. The service herein authorized to be suspended, may be resumed by applicants at any time upon notice to the Commission and the public which shall be given not less than one (1) day prior to the expiration of the suspension period hereinabove specified, or of such extension thereof as may be granted by further order.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
