BY THE COMMISSION:

ORDER

The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company is authorized to construct one spur track at grade across Commercial Street, at the location described in Exhibit "C" of the application, to be identified as Crossing No. 2-167.02-C, and one additional spur track at grade across Patt Street, at the location described in Exhibit "A" of the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. 2-167.1-C, and along and across Commercial Street, as shown in the same Exhibit. Crossing of the southern portion of Commercial Street at approximately E.S. 9/00 shall be identified as Crossing No. 2-167.25-C. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G.O. No. 72, without super-elevation and of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding 2%. Protection shall be as follows:

Within thirty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
