OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant is a common carrier of passengers between Long Beach and Avalon, Santa Catalina Island. Its verified application discloses that due to war conditions the United States Government has prohibited vessel service between these points. It seeks authority to suspend operations until this prohibition is lifted.

In view of the restrictions imposed for security reasons by the United States Government, it appears that the sought authority should be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that applicant be and it is hereby authorized to suspend its common carrier by vessel service between Long Beach and Avalon for such period as the aforesaid restrictions remain in effect; that it shall amend its tariff on file with the Commission, on not less than three (3) days' notice to the Commission and to the public, to show that its operations have been temporarily suspended as authorized herein; and that, immediately upon termination of the suspension, it shall further amend said tariff, on like notice to the Commission and to the public, to show that its operations have been resumed.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
