BY THE COMMISSION:

OPINION AND ORDER

By this application J. E. Wilmot seeks authority to sell to E. J. Evans and A. L. Evans, copartners, property and equipment used in conducting utility warehouse and nonutility operations at Oceanside.¹ The verified application shows that Wilmot desires to devote his full time to other activities; that the purchasers are experienced warehousemen; and that they intend to construct additional facilities in order to meet increased demands for storage. No change in rates is proposed. The consideration is \$10,000 payable in cash.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that to the extent the application involves the sale of property necessary and useful in the public utility warehouse operations in question it should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that J. E. Wilmot be and he is hereby authorized to sell property necessary and useful in the public utility warehouse operations involved in the above entitled proceeding to E. J. Evans and A. L. Evans, copartners.

The property includes the warehouse, certain cleaning, elevating and piling equipment, and office furniture and fixtures.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that, immediately upon transfer of the property involved, J. E. Wilmot, E. J. Evans and A. L. Evans shall, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public, supplement or reissue the tariff on file with the Commission in so far as it names rates, rules and regulations governing warehouse operations of J. E. Wilmot at Oceanside to show that the former has withdrawn or canceled and that the latter have concurrently adopted or established as their own said rates, rules and regulations; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall in all other respects comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
