OPINION AND ORDER

Elva De Pue Matthews, an individual operating warehouses under the name of De Pue Warehouse Company at various points in the Sacramento Valley, including Logandale, Glenn County, seeks authority to lease her "Logandale Warehouse" to L. H. Cummins for a two-year period. The verified application discloses that Cummins is an experienced warehouseman and that there will be no change in tariff rates or in service to the public.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Elva De Pue Matthews, an individual doing business as De Pue Warehouse Company, be and she is hereby authorized to lease the public utility warehouse property involved in this proceeding to L. H. Cummins for a period of not more than two years.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that immediately upon the leasing of the property involved Elva De Pue Matthews and L. H. Cummins shall, on not less than five (5) days' notice to the Commission and to the public, supplement or reissue the tariff on file with the Commission naming rates, rules and regulations governing warehouse operations of Elva De Pue Matthews, doing business as De Pue

Warehouse Company, at Logandale, to show that the former has withdrawn or canceled and that the latter has concurrently adopted or established as his own said rates, rules and regulations; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall in all other respects comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
