ORDER OF DISMISSAL

The Commission on the 24th day of June, 1941, issued its order instituting an investigation upon its own motion into the reasonableness of the rules and regulations of the Sutter Butte Canal Company and of the practices of the company respecting the priorities accorded consumers for water deliveries during periods of water shortage, directed primarily to relieve the confusion and remedy the serious damage caused and threatened by the failure of said company's main diversion dam on the Feather River. Public hearings on this proceeding, including certain other kindred matters, were held before former Commissioners Riley and Havenner on June 27 and 28, and July 14, 1941. The primary purposes of this investigation long since have been satisfied. Accordingly, it appears proper at this time that the proceeding be dismissed. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the investigation of Sutter Butte Canal Co., above entitled, be and hereby is dismissed.
