FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Department of Public Works of the State of California is authorized to construct at grade a Naval Industrial Access Highway (Bay Boulevard) across two spur tracks serving the United States Navy in the immediate vicinity of Highway Engineer's Station 67 / 00, at the location described in the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. 2-272.3. Applicant shall bear entire construction expense. Maintenance costs outside of lines two feet outside of rails of each track shall be borne by the City of National City. The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company shall bear maintenance costs between such lines. Width of crossing shall be not less than 44 feet and grades of approach not greater than 2%. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of C. O..
No. 72. Protection shall be that provided by Decision No. 37591, dated January 3, 1945, which shall include flagging of train movements on the two additional spur tracks.

Within thimty days after completion, pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This

authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
