THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

For the reasons set forth in Decision No. 35722, as amended, in this proceeding, applicant was authorized to suspend its public utility warehouse service for the storage of new automobiles in San Francisco, until September 1, 1945. Extension of this authority for a period of one year or for the duration of the war and six months thereafter is now sought. The verified application shows that the United States Army is still using the warehouse involved; that other suitable facilities are not available because of circumstances connected with the war effort; and that no demand for public storage of new automobiles is anticipated for the duration of the war and some time thereafter unless their manufacture and sale to the public generally in volume to require storage should be permitted at an earlier date.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that a one-year extension of applicant's authority is justified.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of the authority granted by Decision No. 35722 of September 1, 1942, as amended, in the above entitled application, be and it is hereby extended to September 1, 1946, unless sooner changed or further extended by appropriate order of the Commission.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Souther Warehouse Company shall, upon exercising the authority herein granted, amend its tariffs on file with the Commission on not less than three (3) days' notice to the Commission and to the public to show that operations have been further suspended as authorized herein.

This order shall become effective twenty (20) days from the date hereof.
