BY THE COMMISSION:

ORDER

Pacific Electric Railway Company is authorized to construct an interchange track at grade across the intersection of Colton Avenue and "F" Street, across an alley between "F" and "G" Streets and across "G" Street in Colton, San Bernardino County, at the locations described in the application, to be identified as follows:

- Colton Ave. and "F" Street as a portion of Crossing No. 6Y-2.98 Alley (not traveled - no number)
- "G" Street as Crossing No. 6Y-3.05-C

Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction of said crossings of "F" and "G" Streets shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72, without superelevation and of a width to conform to the portions of the streets now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway, and with grades of approach as shown on profiles attached to the application. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (G. O. No. 75-B) at Crossing No. 6Y-2.98 and two Standard No. 1 crossing signs at Crossing No. 6Y-3.05-C.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
