ORDER REVOKING CERTIFICATE

By Decision No. 29778 in Case No. 3824, and Decisions Nos. 27819, 31530, and 31893 in Applications Nos. 19705, 21650, and 22607, respectively, Marine Service Corporation was authorized to conduct transportation services as a common carrier by vessel upon San Francisco Bay and waters tributary thereto. An investigatory order was issued on May 29, 1945, reciting that the corporation had discontinued vessel transportation services and had disposed of equipment used therein, and that no authorization for such discontinuance had been granted by the Commission. The order directed respondent to file a written response or answer within fifteen days after service, and placed respondent upon notice that unless it denied the facts set forth and requested a public hearing, an ex parte revocation order would be issued.

The investigatory order was personally served on the respondent on June 29, 1945, and no written response or answer thereto has been made.

In view of the foregoing circumstances, and it appearing that respondent is no longer conducting a transportation service as a common carrier by vessel,

IT IS ORDERED that the operative authority held by MARINE SERVICE CORPORATION pursuant to the aforementioned decisions be and it is hereby revoked, and tariffs on file cancelled.

The Secretary is directed to cause a copy of this order to be served upon Marine Service Corporation, and this order shall become effective on the twentieth day after such service.
