O P I N I O N

## BY THE COMMISSION:

Southern California Edison Company Ltd. in this application asks the Railroad Commission to make its Order authorizing the utility to carry out the terms of a special contract with the City of Anaheim. This contract contains the terms and conditions under which the utility undertakes to furnish electric service to the City. A copy of the contract dated July 10, 1945, is attached to and made a part of the application as Exhibit "A."

Applicant points out that electric service has heretofore been rendered to the City in accordance with the provisions of a contract dated May 13, 1940, which contract is terminated by the provisions of the 1945 contract.

In support of its petition, Applicant alleges that the load characteristics of the City of Anaheim have changed materially since May, 1940, as a result of the increase in demand and use of electricity and the improvement in load factor. This improvement in characteristics has led the City to believe that it was entitled to a more favorable rate. The previous contract was for a term of ten years, and from month to month thereafter until terminated at the written request of either party. The present contract runs until May 10, 1950, and from month to month thereafter until terminated by written notice of either party. Applicant asserts that the rates provided in the 1945 contract are designed to provide more adequately for the improved load characteristics.

Comparison of the rate schedules contained in each of the contracts can be shown by the following tabulation:

It will be noted from the table that more favorable rates apply where the demands exceed 3,000 kw per month and where the load factor equals or exceeds 55%.

The contract further establishes a minimum charge equal to the demand charge; establishes a 30-minute maximum demand interval; and a minimum of 70% of the maximum demand of the preceding eleven months. Demands occurring between 11 p.m. and 6 a.m. are not to be considered in establishing the billing demand. A power factor adjustment clause provides for a maximum penalty or discount of 10%. Service will be rendered at any standard nominal voltage of 2400 volts or more.

The Commission being of the opinion that the application should be granted and that a hearing in the matter is not necessary, therefore,

O R D E R

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern California Edison Company Ltd. be and it is hereby authorized to carry out the provisions and to charge the rates contained in that certain agreement dated July 10, 1945, between said utility and the City of Anaheim, covering the sale and purchase of electric energy and service; and:

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Southern California Edison Company Ltd. be and it is hereby authorized to cancel that special agreement dated

May 13, 1940, between said utility and the City of Anaheim, covering the sale and purchase of electric energy and service.

The authority herein granted shall become effective as of the date hereof.
