FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 38102, dated July 27, 1945, Pacific Electric Railway Company was authorized, among other things, to construct an interchange track at grade across the intersection of Colton Avenue and "F" Street in the City of Colton (Crossing No. 6Y-2.98), to be protected by two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (G.O. No. 75-B).

Applicant now advises that this crossing is constructed and ready for operation, with the exception of the No. 8 crossing signals which cannot now be installed due to non-delivery of material, and requests that it be authorized to operate over this crossing pending the installation of these Standard No. 8 signals, by temporarily flagging trains across said Colton Avenue and "F" Street.

Good Cause Appearing IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that pending the installation of two Standard No. 8 crossing signals (G.O. No. 75-B) at Crossing No. 6Y-2.98, Pacific Electric Railway Company be authorized to operate trains over said crossing provided all such train movements are flagged by a member of the train crew or other authorized employee.

In all other respects Decision No. 38102 shall remain in full force and effect.
