BY THE COMMISSION:

ORDER

WHEREAS, Mrs. Grace Hendricks, who owns and operates a telephone system in the town of Snelling and vicinity in Merced County, California, under the name of Snelling Telephone Exchange, has applied to the Railroad Commission of the State of California for authority to file and make effective a rate for public pay station service, and

WHEREAS, the furnishing of public pay station service at five (5) cents per exchange message will be in the interest of the subscribers and users of the telephone service of Snelling Telephone Exchange; and it appearing that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is required, therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Mrs. Grace Hendricks be and she hereby is authorized to charge and collect the sum of five (5) cents for each local telephone message from public pay stations in her territory on and after October 15, 1945.

The authority herein granted is subject to the condition that the necessary tariff schedule be submitted for filing with the Railroad Commission in accordance with General Order No. 96, on or before October 10, 1945.
