OPINION AND ORDER

Floyd A. Greene and D. J. Glardon are copartners operating under the name of Arrow Transfer. They were authorized, for reasons stated in Decision No. 36676 in Application No. 25733, to transport flour between points within the City of San Diego at rates less than those otherwise established as minima for this transportation. The authority is scheduled to expire on October 26, 1945. By this application, its extension for a period of one year is sought.

The verified application discloses that there has been no substantial change in the general conditions under which the service is performed and that, although the cost of performing the service has increased somewhat since this matter was last considered a year ago, operations under the authorized rates have continued to be compensatory.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the sought extension of authority should be granted. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the expiration date of Decision No. 36676 of October 26, 1943, in Application No. 25733, be and it is hereby extended to October 26, 1946, unless sooner changed,

cancelled or further extended by appropriate order of the
Commission.

This order shall become effective October 26, 1945.
