O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company is authorized to relocate one spur and construct an additional spur track at grade across Powell Street in Emeryville, Alameda County, at the locations described in the application, to be identified as a portion of Crossing No. A-7.2. Applicant shall bear entire construction and maintenance expense. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of G. O. No. 72 of a width to conform to the portion of the street now graded, with tops of rails flush with roadway, and with grades of approach not exceeding two per cent. Protection shall be by one Standard No. 1 crossing sign (G. O. No. 75-B) and one wigwag now in place.

No train, motor, engine or car shall enter upon the crossing herein authorized at a speed greater than ten miles per hour and unless traffic on the highway be protected by a member of the train crew or other competent employee acting as flagman.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall become void if not exercised within one year, unless time be extended, or if above-conditions are

not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity or safety so require. This order shall be effective immediately.
