## OPINIOU

By Decision No. 37737, dated March 20, 1945, applicant was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing it to establish and operate a service as a passenger stage corporation for the transportation of passengers within and adjacent to San Diego, on and along several routes including Route Kl, as follows:

Commencing at the intersection of National
Avenue and 32nd Street; thence along 32nd
Street to the United States Naval Repair Base
(formerly called United States Destroyer Base)."

By Decision No. 37955, dated June 5, 1945, this Commission ordered Decision No. 37737 amended in several respects including an amendment eliminating and striking out "the description of Route K-1 (sheet 5 of said Decision No. 37737)."

Applicant had requested authority to abandon its
Route Kl service on the ground that such service was solely
for the purpose of transporting workers to and from the United
States Naval Repair Base and that such service would no longer
be needed on account of the diversion of part of applicant's

Route N bus service to Harbor Drive.

As justification for the reestablishment of said service applicant states that a federal housing project has recently been completed in the vicinity of 46th Street and Logan Avenue; that numerous Naval personnel employed at the Repair Base have moved into said housing project with their families; and that public convenience and necessity now require a restoration of bus service along said route in order to transport workers and Naval personnel between the Repair Base and their homes.

Applicant proposes McCandless Boulevard as the southern terminus of said Route Kl because said boulevard is approximately 200 feet from Harbor Drive, along which the Repair Base is situated, and a closer approach would involve crossing the main line tracks of both the Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company, and San Diego and Arizona Eastern Railway Company, and because buses cannot be turned around in the intersection of 32nd Street and Harbor Drive.

Applicant proposes the same fares and type of service previously in effect. No other carrier will be affected by the reestablishment of said service.

It appearing that the reestablishment of bus service over said Route Kl will be in the public interest, the application will be granted. A public hearing is not necessary.

San Diego Electric Railway Company is hereby placed upon notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate-fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of such rights. "Aside from their purely permissive aspect, they extend to the holder a full or partial

General Order No. 79 and Part IV of General Order No. 93-A by filing, in triplicate, and concurrently making effective, appropriate

tariffs and time schedules within sixty (60) days from the effective date hereof and on not less than one (1) day's notice to the Commission and the public.

(c) Subject to the authority of this Commission to change or modify it at any time by further order, applicant shall conduct said passenger stage service over and along the following route:

Beginning at the intersection of National Avenue and 32nd Street (National City), thence along 32nd Street to its intersection with McCandless Boulevard.
