OPINION AND ORDER

This application involves the proposed transfer of public utility warehouse property situated at Tulare. The limited partnership which owned and operated these facilities was dissolved, pursuant to the articles of partnership, upon the death of one of the general partners on September 5, 1945. The surviving partners have formed a new limited partnership. They propose to continue the warehouse operations without change in the service available to the public or in the rates therefor.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

Therefore, good cause appearing,

partnership dissolved, be and it is hereby authorized to transfer the public utility warehouse property involved in this proceeding to J. D. Heiskell and Co., a limited partnership; that, immediately upon transfer of the aforesaid property, applicants shall, on not less than five (5) days notice to the Commission and to the public, supplement or reissue the tariff on file with the Commission in so far as it names rates, rules and regulations governing warehouse operations of J. D. Heiskell and Co., a limited partnership

dissolved, to show that it has withdrawn or canceled and that J. D. Heiskell and Co., a limited partnership, has concurrently adopted or established as its own said rates, rules and regulations; and that the tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall in all other respects comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of warehouse tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61.

This order shall become effective on the date hereof.
