FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER**ORIGINAL**

Transfer to S. D. Schivo and Harold Schivo of a highway common carrier operative right permitting operations in general between San Francisco and San Jose, and between Redwood City and Oakland, was authorized by Decision No. 26659 dated December 18, 1933. The Supplemental Application of Harold P. Schivo, surviving son of Stephen D. Schivo, deceased, asserts that the latter's interest in the operative right and equipment has been distributed to applicant pursuant to a final decree of distribution entered by the Superior Court in and for the City and County of San Francisco (Re: Estate of Stephen D. Schivo, deceased, No. 92811).

Good cause appearing, IT IS ORDERED that Harold P. Schivo is authorized and directed to operate said highway common carrier service and file appropriate tariffs and time tables in his own name.
